14TH INAUGURAL LECTURE: OLUTAYO ADVOCATES FOR ABOLITION OF INFLAMMATORY LANGUAGE

At the 14th edition of Bowen University's inaugural lecture series held on Thursday, June 27, 2024, Professor Grace Olutayo of the College of Liberal Studies called for the elimination of provocative language in communication. Addressing civil servants, government officials, and professionals across various sectors, Professor Olutayo emphasised the need for courteous, empathetic, and purposeful conversations.

In her lecture titled "Language: A Spice for Seasoned Conversations," Olutayo noted that conflicts and crises are better managed with well-chosen, respectful language. She defined seasoned conversations as respectful exchanges that manage interruptions and facilitate smooth interaction, fostering meaningful dialogue.

Olutayo stressed that effective conversations blend the right "ingredients" to elevate discourse, fostering empathy and bridging cultural gaps. She urged politicians and educators to adopt this approach, noting that respectful communication can enhance students' interest and academic performance.

Professor Olutayo also addressed the issue of research funding in Nigeria, attributing the limited contributions of Nigerian researchers in nation-building to inadequate support in research funding. She called on the government to encourage research in universities to enhance societal development. The Vice-Chancellor, Professor Jonathan Babalola FAS, echoed her sentiments, affirming the power of words in shaping society and urging politicians, academics and other members of society to heed this advice.

IKOTUN SECURES £5,000 RSC GRANT FOR PIONEERING CHEMICAL SCIENCES WORKSHOP

This funding is for the upcoming 2024 Bowen-RSC Research and Community Development Workshop titled "Exploring Global Opportunities with a Good Degree in Chemical Sciences," scheduled to take place from August 4th to 7th, 2024.

The workshop aims to gather around 80 participants, encompassing individuals studying for a degree in Chemical Sciences from secondary schools to undergraduate and postgraduate levels. This initiative is set to provide valuable insights and opportunities, fostering a deeper understanding of the global prospects available to those with a solid foundation in Chemical Sciences.

Professor Ikotun's project promises to be a landmark event, designed to inspire and equip the next generation of chemical scientists with the knowledge and skills needed to thrive in a global context. The workshop will feature a series of interactive sessions, expert-led discussions, and hands-on activities that will engage and challenge attendees, preparing them for future success in their academic and professional pursuits.

This award not only underscores Prof. Ikotun's dedication and expertise but also highlights Bowen University's commitment to advancing research and community development within the field of Chemical Sciences.

BOWEN'S HALLELUJAH AWORINDE (PHD) AND UI'S ADERONKE SAKPERE (PHD) RECEIVE PRESTIGIOUS \$18,000 GOOGLE EXPLORECSR GRANT

It is with great pride that we announce Dr Halleluyah Oluwatobi Aworinde, a Computer Science Lecturer and Director of Digital Services at Bowen University, Iwo, along with Dr. Aderonke Busayo Sakpere, a Computer Science Lecturer at the University of Ibadan, have been awarded the esteemed Google exploreCSR grant for the 2023/2024 cohort. Their innovative proposal on the intersection of Human-Computer Interaction (HCI) and Artificial Intelligence (AI) has secured funding to the tune of \$18,000, standing out among fifty globally selected projects for this highly competitive grant.

The project, executed in three phases, commenced at the University of Ibadan and Bowen University, with the third phase held at the NITDA IT Hub in Lagos. From a pool of 1,202 applicants, only the top 8% were selected for this capacity-building programme, ensuring a diverse and inclusive representation from all six geopolitical regions and various universities across Nigeria.

Adopting a project-based learning (PBL) approach, the programme featured sessions on research writing, design principles, graduate school survival tips, usability testing, augmented/virtual reality, AutoML, and more. The sessions were enriched by the presence of distinguished academics and industry speakers, including Prof Adenike Osofisan, Prof Rita Orji, Mr Segun Ogunwale, Dr Wilson Sakpere, Dr Segun Adebayo, Itohowo Udofia, Itunu Abidoye, and Onyinye Enyioha, among others.

Highlights of the project included pre- and post-event mentorship initiatives, the selection of nine top capstone projects for seed grants, and graduate school mentorship and application scholarships for selected participants. The team members of the top nine capstone projects participated in a week-long incubation session at the NITDA IT Hub, Lagos. Under the guidance of Dr Victor Odumuyiwa, industry experts mentored the participants on transforming their project ideas into Minimum Viable Products (MVPs). Additionally, participants had the unique opportunity to engage with Googlers at Google Nigeria, Lagos.

This project's success underscores the significance of strategic collaborations and the immense potential for innovation in HCI and AI. We eagerly anticipate the continued growth and achievements of all participants, heralding a bright future for technological advancements and research excellence.

The participating institutions included the University of Lagos, Enugu State University of Science and Technology, University of Ibadan, Obafemi Awolowo University, Cross Rivers State University, University of Calabar, Landmark University, Adamawa State University, Ahmadu Bello University, University of Nigeria, Nsukka, and Nnamdi Azikiwe University, Awka.

The inter-university debate aimed to foster a culture of debate, equipping young people with a robust understanding of human rights. Mr Sanusi highlighted the importance of nurturing a generation that values and advocates human rights, envisioning a future Nigeria where human rights are respected and upheld.
