BOWEN UNIVERSITY GRADUATES 5TH SET OF NURSING STUDENTS WITH 100% SUCCESS IN PROFESSIONAL EXAMS

Bowen University marked a significant milestone on Thursday, September 19, 2024, as it inducted its 5th set of nursing graduates. The event saw 46 new nursing professionals, who all achieved a remarkable 100% pass rate in their Registered Midwife (RM), Registered Nurse (RN), and Registered Public Health Nurse (RPHN) professional examinations. Adisa Adeola, the overall best-graduating student, praised Bowen University for its dedication to student success, highlighting the institution's experienced faculty and the well-equipped teaching hospital that provided them with hands-on clinical training. Speaking at the induction ceremony, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Jonathan Babalola FAS FRSC, emphasized the importance of rigorous clinical training in producing competent nurses ready to deliver high-quality healthcare services. He reiterated that nursing graduates should not be allowed to practice without adequate exposure to real-world clinical environments, as this is vital for saving lives and preventing medical errors, and expressed pride in Bowen University's commitment to empowering its students with the knowledge and skills required to excel in their professions. He noted that the university's comprehensive training prepares graduates for both local and global healthcare sectors, enabling them to meet the demands of the profession.

The Guest Lecturer, Prof. Christiana Sowunmi, spoke on the global impact of Nigerian nurses, particularly those who migrate. In her lecture titled Global Healthcare Game-Changer: The Remarkable Impact of Nigerian Nurse Migration, she encouraged the graduates to complete their registration and practice in Nigeria before exploring opportunities abroad. Prof. Sowunmi argued that while migration can create temporary workforce gaps, it also offers immense benefits through knowledge transfer and remittances, which contribute to nation-building.

Representing the Secretary-General/Registrar of the Nursing and Midwifery Council of Nigeria, Dr. Faruk Abubakar, ModupeAyoola urged the new inductees to uphold the highest standards of ethical practice and compassion. She applauded Bowen University for fostering a conducive environment that enables nursing students to excel, attributing the institution's consistent success in professional examinations to its quality education and mentorship.

COMMUNICATION ARTS PROGRAMME LEADS INITIATIVE TO IMPROVE WORKPLACE COMMUNICATION AND EMOTIONAL HEALTH

In a continued effort to foster emotional wellbeing and enhance workplace communication, Bowen University's Communication Programme organized a two-day workshop titled "Improving Communication: Emotional change Challenges in Workplace" from August 26th to 27th, 2024. The event, held at the Red Hall, was facilitated by Professor Ola Ogunyemi, a visiting scholar to the programme from Lincoln University, UK, and focused on addressing emotional challenges and stress management in the workplace. The workshop catered to both academic and non-academic practical tools to staff, offering improve communication and emotional intelliaence. Participants were engaged in interactive sessions aimed at identifying emotional stressors related to their roles and developing strategies for better workload management and career development. The workshop identified three key areas for improvement: workload management, career development opportunities, and human resource capacity building. On the first day, non-academic staff explored how to manage emotional risks from workplace stress, focusing on trauma and its effects. The second day addressed the emotional toll of research and teaching for academic staff, providing strategies for managing stress. Professor Ogunyemi proposed regular staff forums and a fair course allocation system to improve workload management and job satisfaction. He also emphasized the need for annual appraisals to support career growth and align staff goals with the university's mission. Overall, the workshop laid a foundation for enhancing staff well-being and productivity, reaffirming Bowen University's commitment to creating a supportive and healthy work environment. As the university moves forward with these initiatives, it continues to solidify its reputation as a forward-thinking institution dedicated to both academic excellence and the well-being of its workforce.

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
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
